DSE CHILDREN EUROPEAN GRAND PRIX (DSE CHEGP)

Must be used from 1 January 2020

1. General Rules:

- 1.1. These rules should be used on any Children European Grand Prix organized under DanceSport Europe (DSE) umbrella.
- 1.2. Everything what is not covered by DSE CHEGP Rules is being directed by WDSF Competition rules.

2. Age groups and Categories:

- 2.1. DSE Children European Grand Prix (DSE CHEGP) are organized for the following:
 - 2.1.1. Juveniles
 - 2.1.2. Junior I
 - 2.1.3. Junior II
- 2.2. Some age groups are allowed to compete in competition designated to higher age groups:
 - 2.2.1. Juveniles can compete in Junior I category
 - 2.2.2. Junior I can compete in Junior II category

3. Disciplines and Dances:

- 3.1. Standard Dances:
 - 3.1.1. Juveniles groups: Waltz, Tango, Viennese Waltz and Quickstep
 - 3.1.2. Juniors groups: Waltz, Tango, Viennese Waltz, Slow Foxtrot and Quickstep
- 3.2. Latin American Dances:
 - 3.2.1. Juveniles groups: Samba, Cha-Cha-Cha, Rumba and Jive
 - 3.2.2. Juniors groups: Samba, Cha-Cha-Cha, Rumba, Paso Doble and Jive

4. Couples:

- 4.1. All couples who will take part in the DSE CHEGP must have an active WDSF competitor licence.
- 4.2. Couples from non DSE member countries can dance in the DSE CGEGP but they will not get the points to DSE Ranking System.

5. Number of Nationalities and Couples:

- 5.1. If 20-24 couples from 4 different countries will participate in certain category - basic points will be provided – according to Appendix 2

5.2. Bonus points – separate for each category:

5.2.1. Number of couples:

- 5.2.1.1. 25-36 couples 10% more points
- 5.2.1.2. 37-48 couples 20% more points
- 5.2.1.3. 49-60 couples 30% more points
- 5.2.1.4. 61 and more couples 40% more points

5.2.2. Number of countries:

- 5.2.2.1. 5-6 countries 10% more points
- 5.2.2.2. 7-10 countries 20% more points
- 5.2.2.3. 11-15 countries 30% more points
- 5.2.2.4. 16 and more countries 40% more points

5.3. If less couples are competing deduction of points will be proceeded:

5.3.1. Number of couples

- 5.3.1.1. 13-19 couples 10% less points
- 5.3.1.2. 8-12 couples 20% less points
- 5.3.1.3. Up to 7 couples 30% less points

5.3.2. Number of countries

- 5.3.2.1. 3 countries 10% less points
- 5.3.2.2. 2 countries 20% less points
- 5.3.2.3. 1 country NO points

5.4. All the points will be rounded to the nearest integer and then use in the DSE Ranking System

6. Adjudicators:

6.1. The panel of 7 adjudicators from 7 different countries, 9 adjudicators from 9 different countries or 11 adjudicators from 11 different countries must be used. If panel of 9 or 11 adjudicators is used 10% more ranking points will be added for couples.

6.2. All adjudicators must have a valid WDSF B or A licence.

6.3. Proposal of Adjudicators panel and Chairperson must be sent in advance to DSE at least in one month in advance, using DSE Adjudicator Sheet – available for download on DSE website.

6.4. Adjudicators panel and Chairperson must be confirmed by DanceSport Europe Managing Committee.

7. Management of DSE CHEGP Ranking Tournaments:

7.1. In all rounds the number of dances should be exactly as its points in rule no 3.

7.2. No Redance round in any case.

7.3. Management of rounds and couples must be exactly like in Appendix 1

8. DSE Ranking Points System:

8.1. All couples competing in DSE CHEGP will get the points according to Rules 5.1-5.3 and Appendix 2 to DSE Ranking Points System.

8.2. The best 6 results of the last 12 months' period will be counted to the DSE Ranking Point System.

8.3. The best couples from all age groups will be announced and rewarded by special cups during the DSE CHEGP **Final of The Year** event – To select best couple of the year **only** results from current calendar year must be calculated.

9. Dress Regulations:

9.1. All couples participating DSE CHEGP must follow the WDSF Dress Regulations.

10. Programme Restrictions:

10.1. In the Juveniles age groups, the programme is limited to Syllabus according to WDSF rules

10.2. In the Juniors age groups, there is no limitation about the dancing programme.

11. Applications:

11.1. Each member country can organize maximum **two** DSE CHEGP events in whole calendar year. Additional competition can be granted to the country only as **Final of The Year** event

11.2. Applications must be sent 3 months in advance to DSE.

11.3. DSE will inform organizer about DSE MC decision in less than 30 days from the date application will be sent.

1. Duties and Obligations:

- 1.1. The member country needs to pay a fee – 600 euro for the event which include all package of DSE CHEGP competitions after receiving an invoice from DSE.
- 1.2. The organizer must conduct all 3 age groups of DSE CHEGP in Standard and Latin in the event.
- 1.3. DSE will provide medals for all top 3 couples in all six categories for each event for their own cost. The organizer needs to pay the cost of delivery the medals (if no costless way will be found).
- 1.4. DSE will provide trophies for the winners of all six categories of the Final of The Year event. The organizer needs to pay the cost of delivery the medals (if no costless way will be found).
- 1.5. The organiser – or pointed scrutineer – must send the results in csv or txt file to be possible to upload the results to DSE database. Scrutineer programs usually allowed to export results to csv or txt file. You can find example csv file to download on DSE website.
Technical requirements for file format:
 - 1.5.1. CSV text file (.txt or .csv extension)
 - 1.5.2. No special letters should be used
 - 1.5.3. Columns divided with semi-colons
 - 1.5.4. Columns order:
male_min;male_name;female_min;female_name;placing;category_name;dse_category_id;dqualification;country
 - 1.5.5. CSV column headers are not required in the file
Column definition:
male_min (**required**) - man MIN
male_name (**required**) - last name and first name of man
female_min (**required**) - woman MIN
female_name (**required**) - last name and first name of woman
placing (**required**) - place, in case of a draw places eg. 5-8 only the highest place should be inserted (5 in that case)
category_name (**required**) - category name
dse_category_id (not required) - category ID from DSE website

If a column is not required it should be left empty.
- 1.6. The organizer must use the full name of the event: DSE Children European Grand Prix (DSE CHEGP)
- 1.7. DSE logo must be used at all promotional materials mentioning DSE CHEGP and furthermore must be visible at the main stage of the event.
- 1.8. DSE must be also promoted by Master of Ceremony during all DSE CHEGP competitions including the prize presentation.
